Letters to the Churches— The Things That Are

- Letters to 7 churches on the roman postal route – in order
- Could loosely correspond to "Church Ages"
- Five of these churches rebuked for tolerating sin
- Modern churches can have a mixture of these characteristics, good and bad





Patterns of the Letters to the Churches

A greeting: 'To the angel of the church in ...'.

A title of the risen Christ, usually taken from the description in chapter 1.

A section headed 'I know', introducing praise for what is good in the church's record (not in the case of Laodicea).

A criticism of the church (not in the case of Smyrna nor Philadelphia).

A warning.

An exhortation beginning, 'He who has an ear ...'.

A promise beginning with something like 'To him who overcomes I will give ...'.

In the last four letters the order of 6 and 7 is reversed.

The Church of Laodicea

7 "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened.

and repent. 20 Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me. 21 The one who conquers, I will grant him to sit with me on my throne, as I also conquered and sat down with my Father on his throne. 22 He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'"

Q: What things did Jesus condemn?

A. Being lukewarm, not hot or cold; pride; thinking they were self-sufficient. Not realizing they are pitiable, poor, blind, and naked

Q: What things did Jesus commend?

A. Nothing!!!

Q: What is Jesus' response to the lukewarm?
A: He vomits them from His mouth. It makes him wretch!

Q: What does Jesus command them to do?

A Be zealous; Repent; Welcome discipline; Open your heart to Jesus

Q: What does sitting on the throne with Jesus mean?

A: We will reign and rule with Jesus

Q: How does Mathew 7:7 contrast with v.20?

A: Direction of the knock; could be indicative of the church in general



21 Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. 22 On that day many will say to me, "Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast our demons in your name, and do many mighty words in your name? 23 And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you, depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'
